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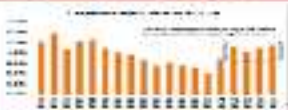
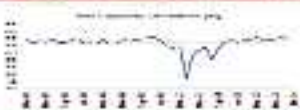

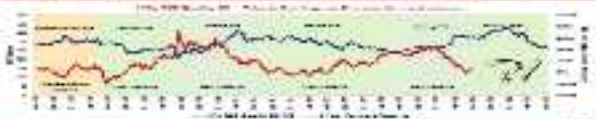
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Hydrograph for monthly precipitation, discharge, and water level at Vicksburg, Mississippi, for the period 1970-1999.
